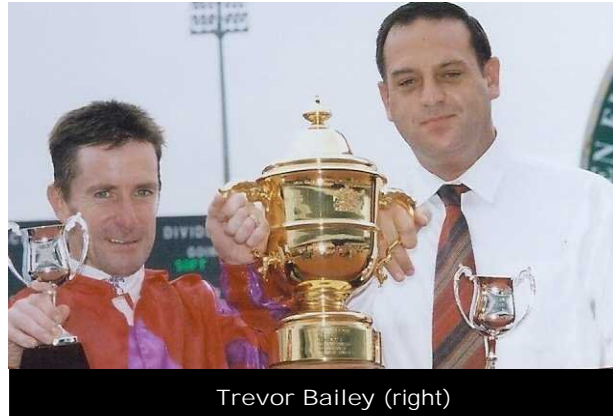

Prior to setting up his Kranji base, Trevor was assistant trainer to his popular father ALAN BAILEY and operated the families' highly successful Melbourne stable at Caulfield. During a three year period, the Trevor Bailey prepared Victorian team collected a swag of feature races around Australia. Star performers for the Melbourne stable included LIBI DINIOUS (SAJC DC McKay S., Gr3, 2d SAJC Goodwood H., Gr1), POINT DANGER (VRC Chivas Regal S., Gr3, 4th VRC Salinger S., Gr1), SUZY GREY (SAJC Swettenham Stud S., Gr2) and STELLA ARTOIS (MVRC William Crockett S., L). Other good performers included Thong And Pushbike, Bold Impulse, Gold Class and Mardi Gras.

After returning from Singapore, Trevor Bailey returned to the Gold Coast to set up a new stable under the family banner of Bailey Racing Australia, training alongside father Alan. In his first full season back the Gold Coast, the 2007/2008 season has proved particularly fruitful for Trevor Bailey. Among the highlights in 2008 have been two stakes wins with the rejuvenated older mares FABIARNA (Listed Juanmo Quality) and PERFECT FEELING (Listed Tattersalls Mile). In the 2008 season, Trevor Bailey's metropolitan winning strike rate of 3.7 was the best of any trainer in Queensland, whilst he placed fourth on the highly competitive Gold Coast Trainers Premiership ladder which was again won by his father Alan Bailey.

In the 2008/2009 season, Trevor Bailey enjoyed stakes success in the \$200,000 Doomben Stakes with BARLINNIE, as well as first time stakesplacegetters KISANI and GO JOHEMMA. His impressive strike rate continued, whilst he finished third in the Gold Coast trainers premiership after leading for a majority of the season.
